

Overview Deficiency Tests 21+ Admission Test

Some study programmes at the HU University of Applied Sciences have a specific subject or profile requirement. This means these programmes demand a certain level of knowledge about a specific subject. Your knowledge of this subject is, therefore, tested as part of the 21+ admission test. In those cases, you'll have to take a deficiency test of the relevant subject in addition to the MCT-H test.

The level of the deficiency tests is similar to the final examination for senior general secondary education. Please note: we don't offer preparatory courses for any of the deficiency tests.

If you applied for **International Business**, you'll take an economy deficiency test immediately after you have completed the MCT-H test. This digital test will take about 30-45 minutes and consists of multiple choice questions.

All of our economic-based degree programmes demand a certain level of knowledge of economics. The English textbook *Economics (5th edition)* from N. Gregory Mankiw (ISBN: 9781473768543) is a good tool to prepare yourself for the test. You'll need to study the following chapters from this book:

The deficiency test for economics consists of 25 multiple-choice questions, covering the contents of the book. If you answer 18 or more questions correctly, you pass.

Please note: It is really necessary to study for this test if you wish to pass.

If you applied for a **Teacher Education** programme in **English, German** or **French**, you will receive an invitation from the coordinator of your study programme. They'll contact you to make an appointment for the deficiency test after you've passed the MCT-H test.

You'll take a language deficiency test for either English, German or French based on your chosen programme. You'll be tested on your reading, writing and speaking skills which need to be at least at level B1.

If you applied for **Creative Business** or **Teacher Education in Spanish** you don't have to take a deficiency test as these study programmes don't have a specific profile requirement.
